Sub: - In our physical life as human beings we are divided into two groups - "the sick," and "the healthy". Note the characteristics of each group.

1. Sick cannot work.
2. Live in fear & suffering
3. Cannot serve others, must be served.

The well: -

1. Do work.
2. Enjoy living.
3. Serve their fellows. It is a blessed, glorious thing to have physical health.
