Scripture Lesson: St. John 6:60-68

Text: - St. John 6:68. "To whom shall we go, thou alone hast the words of eternal life"

Int: - The words of Peter when carefully weighed indicate that he was intensely interested in eternal life. He had seen people turn away from Christ; for many had just turned away from him - *is ta onisw*. Jesus thus said to the twelve, "will ye also go away?" -

I am concerned tonight with the person who has turned back, and with the one who has not turned to Christ.

The one who has turned back -
What did you turn back to?
To your sins; to your misery;
You have turned your back
on the hope of heaven, for
you have turned away from
the one who has eternal life.

To one who has not turned
to Christ. Why are you not
a Christian? Christ is one

Who has the words of eternal life. He is only one who can save you.

I. You Have Often Felt Need

1. Your heart is hungry for God. There are times when that hunger is greater than at other times. There are times when you can say with the Psalmist. As the hart panteth after the water-brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God!

But in these moments comes the tempter to turn you aside. He presents his arguments and you listen. He seems to present good reasons for not being a Christian.

II. The Devil's Arguments.
